In 2019, PEPFAR supported the following achievements in Kenya:



Life-saving antiretroviral treatment over 1.1 million people



Voluntary medical male circumcision for HIV prevention for 264,490 men



Testing and counseling for over 12.4 million people



Care and support for 641,233 OVC affected by HIV/AIDS



Antiretroviral medications for 56,821 pregnant women living with HIV to reduce the risk of mother-to-child transmission

The United States is proud to support Kenya's leadership in the global HIV/AIDS response. PEPFAR provides service delivery and technical assistance in Kenya to maximize the quality, coverage, and impact of the national HIV/AIDS response. Working together with the Government of Kenya, PEPFAR is aligning investments to scale up interventions that are most effective in the areas and populations with the highest burden of HIV/AIDS

PEPFAR is the U.S. Government initiative to help save the lives of those suffering from HIV/AIDS around the world. **Since 2004, the U.S. Government has invested over 6 billion US Dollars in the HIV response in Kenya and is currently the largest global U.S. government HIV program.** The relationship between the United States Government and the Government of Kenya is one of partnership. The PEPFAR Program is coordinated out of the PEPFAR Coordination Office and implemented by committed Kenyan and American technical staff of the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the Department of Defense (DOD) - U.S. Army Medical Research Unit / Walter Reed Project (USAMRU/WRP), Peace Corps and the U.S. Agency for International Development (USAID). Since its launch in 2003, PEPFAR working closely with many partners has accomplished the following:

- Life-saving antiretroviral treatment (ART) for 1.1 million men, women, and children
- Over 164,000 HIV-positive pregnant women have received antiretroviral to reduce risk of mother-to-child-transmission (MTCT) during pregnancy and delivery this year alone
- Caring for over 600,000 Orphans and Vulnerable children
- 26,795 human resources for health, translating to \$64,443,900
- Support of 3,670 HIV comprehensive care clinics in Kenya
